

Changing Values *Registry-editing tricks*

dancing chickens, it's your business. No one else should be able to change it.

In your Registry Editor, go to `HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Policies\System`. If you see a value called `NoDispScrSavPage`, change its data to *1* (one).

If not, click Edit and select New DWORD value. Right-click the value and select Rename. Type *NoDispScrSavPage* and press Enter. Double-click the value and change the value data to *1* (one). Click OK.

This hides the Screensaver tab in your Display properties box.

Setting the value data back to *0* (zero) will show it again.

No background control

Here's a trick that will prevent people from changing your Desktop background, you can remove its option from the Display control panel.

Go to `HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Policies\System` once more. This time check to see if a value exists named `NoDispBackgroundPage`. If it is there, change the value to *1* (one).

If it isn't there, select the Edit menu and click New and DWORD Value. Right-click on the new value and select Rename. Type *NoDispBackgroundPage*. Press Enter and double-click on the value. Under Value Data, type *1* and click OK.

To make the tab appear again set the value to *0* (zero).

No DOS

Most people never need to use DOS or the Command Line interface directly, so if you'd like to get rid of the MS-DOS/Command Prompt in Windows,



Can't remember what you last copied? Right-click on your Desktop and choose Paste. If the last thing you copied was a file, it will now appear as a desktop item. If it was just part of a file, like a few words, it will appear as a Document Scrap. After you have a look, you can delete the item and it will still be in memory.
